Virginia's Consumer Data Privacy Act (CDPA) passed with incredible speed, making it only the second piece of comprehensive data privacy legislation in the United States. Enacted to protect the privacy of state residents, the CDPA applies to entities conducting business in Virginia as well as those producing products or services targeting state residents. Scheduled to go into effect on January 1, 2023, the CDPA will require businesses to make many adjustments to their practices. Although there is a significant amount of time to prepare, it is important for businesses to understand the act's implications and to start preparing for this major change.
