Nonlawyer Gets Chance to Enforce Alleged Legal Fee-Split Pact

The decision breathes new life into a lawsuit by SCF Consulting LLC, a nonlawyer consulting firm, which claims that Barrack, Rodos & Bacine promised SCF 5 percent of the law firm's annual profits from cases that SCF originated and worked on.
