



# New York Note: Council Budget Response, PEG Elimination, PBA Agreement

## City Council Releases Preliminary Budget Response

City Council has released their FY24 preliminary budget response. The response outlines \$1.3B in investments in housing, workforce development, essential services, and health and safety, and calls for \$1.4B to add to reserves to address potential risks in the state budget. Council also called for the administration to address current vacancies in city government.

#### Adams Announces PEG Elimination

The Adams administration has ordered city agencies to cut their budgets by an additional 4%, in addition to the directives from last year. Budget Director Jacques Jiha notified agency heads that the Mayor's FY24 executive budget proposal will include these new cuts, known as a Program to Eliminate the Gap (PEG). Jiha cited labor needs, state budget cuts, and the migrant crisis as the cause for these cuts.

#### Contract Agreement with PBA

Mayor Adams and NYC Office of Labor Relations Commissioner Renee Campion announced that a tentative contract agreement has been reached with the Patrolmen's Benevolent Association (PBA).

The eight-year agreement is retroactive to 2017 and runs through 2025, and includes wage increases from 2.25% to 4% over the contract period. The terms also include a pilot program allowing extended tours of 10- and 12-hour shifts for increased flexibility.
